### A sustainable future in Jurong-Clementi



he unveiling of the Singapore Green Plan 2023 has sparked a nationwide interest in sustainability and climate change, with more people embracing eco-living as a way of life. This ties in with the pioneering initiative Action for Green Towns, a collaboration involving all 15 Town Councils that is guided by three enterprising ethos: have zero waste, be energy-efficient, and become greener by 2025.

Of course, one can never go wrong if he adheres to the very fundamentals of eco-living: reduce, reuse and recycle. Jurong-Clementi residents can now easily render their discarded objects a second life at

more than 70 sustainability collection points located around the estate. Having partnered strategic environmental organisations such as SG Recycle, ALBA and Cloop, the Jurong-Clementi precinct has a trove of recycling opportunities for residents eager to do their part to save our

#### Types of collection points

Residents should take note that every sustainability collection point has a specific function and purpose.

#### 1) 3-in-1 Bin by ALBA

These bins are dedicated solely to the disposal of your electronic waste (e-waste). To be more precise, they can collect your batteries (though limited to AA, AAA, AAAA, D, C, 9-volt and Button cells), bulbs and Infocomm Technology Equipment or ICTs such as printers, computers and mobile phones.

#### 2) Bulb and Battery (BB) Bins by ALBA

As the name suggests, these bins are prepared exclusively for the disposal of your batteries and lamps.

#### 3) Paper Recycling Bins by ALBA

Cardboards, newspapers, magazines and more - you can bin any of your paper objects easily at any of ALBA's paper recycling spots.

#### 4) Cash for Trash Stations by ALBA

Bring your recyclables such as electronics, cardboard boxes, newspapers and clothing down to ALBA, and you might leave feeling a little richer.

#### 5) Bottle and Can Recycling with SG Recycle

Drop your used bottles and cans into these machines and be rewarded with cash for it!

#### 6) Recycle your Clothes at Cloop Textile Recycling

These bins accept your clothes, bags, shoes and even household items such as pillows, toys and linens.

#### 7) Upcycle your Chopsticks with Chopvalue SG

Chopvalue SG turns your disposable chopsticks into decorative pieces such as wine holders and an adjustable office desks. Join them in their recycling endeavours and watch them uplift your waste with a creative flair.

## Getting creative with used chopsticks

elix Böck, the founder of ChopValue,
was enjoying sushi with his then
girlfriend (now wife) at a restaurant
in Vancouver, Canada when he noticed the
vast amount of disposable chopsticks being
thrown away after being used for less than
30 minutes. Armed with a degree in wood
engineering, Mr Böck was struck by the waste
and began to imagine a new life for these
discarded utensils.

With a passion for sustainability and a desire to create something unique and beautiful, he began experimenting by turning disposable chopsticks into handmade furniture and other daily lifestyle products such as coasters and phone stands. Today, ChopValue, which was established in 2016, has become a thriving business with 63 indevelopment franchises globally, including in Singapore, Indonesia, Mexico, Canada, the United States and the United Kingdom. Together with its dedicated artisans, ChopValue is committed to reducing waste and supporting the circular economy.

According to the company's general manager, Justin Lee (right), who oversees

the ChopValue franchise in Singapore, the company has collected 100 million chopsticks as of April 2023 since it came into being. Of the 100 million, 10 million chopsticks came from Singapore. "The 10 million chopsticks are equivalent to 13,800kg of carbon dioxide, which would have been generated if we incinerated the chopsticks – an action that would have contributed to climate change," shares Mr Lee.

Each product is manufactured locally at the respective factories worldwide to further reduce its carbon footprint. In Singapore, chopsticks are collected from local partner restaurants and sent back to ChopValue's 2,500sqft microfactory in Loyang Way. It goes through a series of processes, such as sorting,

using eco-friendly resin as a binder, and baking for eight

to 16 hours to sanitise
and remove any food
debris instead of using
water. "These chopsticks
are then processed into
8x8-inch wooden tiles,
which are used to create our

products," explains Mr Lee.

Since it began operations in Singapore in 2021, ChopValue has established 130 collection points, two of which are located at Yuhua Village Hawker Centre at Blk 254, Jurong East Street 24 and Yuhua Place Hawker Centre at Blk 347, Jurong East St 31. "Our partnership with Jurong-Clementi Town Council [JRTC] came about after they read one of the media articles highlighting our work. After visiting our factory, they decided to establish designated bins at the hawker centres where residents and participating stakeholders can dispose of the chopsticks into the designated bins," says Mr Lee. Residents can also post their disposable bamboo chopsticks to ChopValue for upcycling.

To raise awareness, Mr Lee and his team also participated in JRTC's green events to explain the upcycling process and showcase its finished products to residents. "Currently, most of our used chopstick collection comes from restaurants, but we also hope to get more hawker centres to participate in the scheme," says Mr Lee, who plans to set up a factory in Kuala Lumpur next year.

Most of ChopValue's furniture is being sold to banks and hotels, although consumers can also purchase the items online. A selection of ChopValue's products is also being showcased at Muji stores and Design Orchard, a concept store that showcases the best of Singapore's homegrown design talent.

### Old textiles find new purpose

Agency report, in 2022 alone, Singapore generated 254,000 tonnes of textile waste, of which only 2 per cent or 5,000 tonnes was recycled.

The global fashion industry, especially fast-fashion, is responsible for up to 8 per cent of global greenhouse gas emissions – more than aviation and shipping emissions combined.

To address this environmental challenge, Singapore-based social entrepreneurs Jasmine Tuan and Tan Yin Ling co-founded Cloop, a circular fashion enterprise that aims to reduce fashion overconsumption and waste in Singapore by providing sustainable solutions for unwanted textiles and preloved apparel.

To this effect, it has teamed up with a Malaysia-based textile recycling company called Life Line Clothing (LLC).

Since launching its first recycling bin in July

2022, there are now more than 300 drop-off points across the island where Singaporeans can donate textiles in any condition – new and old. In March alone, the company collected 8,640kg of textiles from the yellow bins placed in 14 locations across Jurong-Clementi estates. The LLC team then collects the textiles and transports them to its facility in Kuala Lumpur.

The next step of the process involves manually sorting the textiles into 500– odd categories and couched under three purposes: reuse, renew and recycle.

After a rigorous sorting process, the items that are in good condition are put up for sale locally, while some are sent to other countries for reuse and resale. The items that are not fit for reuse are repurposed.

For example, they can be used as wipers or raw materials for household items such as gloves, tote bags or floor mats. Items that are not suitable for any of the three purposes are burnt together with coal to produce energy, and the residual ash is then used in the clinker which is part of the concrete material base – a zero-waste-to-landfill process.

Residents can scan the QR code on the textile recycling bins to download the susGain app, a rewards-based engagement app to drive sustainable behavioural change within communities.

The use of the app allows the public to earn 200 points each time they donate, shop or swap with Cloop. An accumulation of 500 points allows users to plant a mangrove tree in Indonesia with Cloop's charity partner Eden Project, a non–profit organisation that helps to restore forests by engaging the local communities.

Cloop and LLC also organise awareness talks for members of the public as well as schoolchildren.



## Jurong Spring and Taman Jurong champion inclusive community

s vibrant communities nestled in the western part of Singapore, Jurong Spring and Taman Jurong have made great strides in embracing neurodiversity, paving the way for a more inclusive and empathetic society.

Neurodiversity is a concept that recognises the diverse ways in which individuals experience and engage with the world, taking into account the fact that each of us interacts with our surroundings in a unique way. It highlights the understanding that there is no single correct approach to thinking, learning and behaving. Instead, it appreciates that differences in neurology are not shortcomings but valuable variations that can contribute to the richness of human experiences. By embracing neurodiversity, our society acknowledges each individual's inherent strengths and perspectives, fostering an inclusive environment that celebrates the unique qualities and talents that every person brings to the

table.
Through various programmes and initiatives, inclusive employment practices at the workplace and how to provide appropriate support for diverse learning and abilities

have been conducted in Jurong Spring and Taman Jurong to raise neurodiversity awareness among teachers, employers and colleagues.

In addition, the two estates are also taking the opportunity to build an inclusive community by housing facilities that cater to people with special needs. For instance, the area previously occupied by Grace Orchard School will be taken over by a cerebral palsy school, and Movement for the Intellectually Disabled of Singapore or MINDS will be moving into Block 509 Jurong West. The latter offers a nurturing environment optimal for continual development of essential life skills, with the aim of enhancing neurodiverse individuals' independence and integration into the community.

The Enabling Business Hub, which will be run by the Ministry of Social and Family Development, will occupy the open area next to Lakeside MRT station. The initiative was announced in the Enabling Masterplan

2030, a road map released in August 2022 on how to support people

with disabilities, and enable them to contribute to society and live productive and financially independent lives. The hub aims to support people with disabilities and prepare them for employment.

Jurong Spring and Taman Jurong estates also aim to build an open ecosystem to



promote neurodiversity integration across the community clubs, cerebral palsy school, hawkers, commercial centres and shops in the neighbourhood. This will allow residents of all backgrounds to come together to recognise and celebrate the community's collective strength while embracing each other's differences.

Embracing neurodiversity within the local community can help to cultivate a culture of understanding and compassion. Such inclusiveness helps to dispel stereotypes and stigmas surrounding neurological conditions such as autism spectrum disorder.

By creating a supportive network in Jurong Spring and Taman Jurong, and connecting with others who share similar experiences, individuals with different abilities will find strength and motivation to navigate quotidian challenges. Moreover, it will help foster and strengthen the community bond further.

## Reinvigorating our neighbourhoods

Programme (NRP) was introduced in 2007 to focus on improvements around neighbourhoods. It takes a consultative approach by engaging residents through a variety of channels such as town halls, dialogue sessions and seminars, during which residents can provide feedback on the improvements they would like to see in their precinct. These improvement works are done with the objective of providing enhanced amenities and convenience to residents.

In the Jurong–Clementi neighbourhood, one of the latest NRPs to be launched is for Blks 468 to 473, Jurong West St 41, built in 1983 and 1984. A total of 474 households will benefit from this programme.

Jurong–Clementi Town Council and the Residents' Committee have been able to obtain 82 per cent support for the NRP to go ahead. Works are expected to commence in the first quarter of 2024 and will be carried out over a period of 15 months. Repair and



repainting works of the same blocks will also be carried out concurrently.

Mr Shawn Huang, MP for Jurong GRC, along with several residents visited the exhibition detailing the NRP. The showcase presented an array of new amenities and facilities for the residents of Jurong Spring neighbourhood. Residents were briefed by the JRTC staff on the upcoming project.



#### What residents can look forward to:



- New multipurpose court with two badminton courts to replace existing futsal court
- New garden signage with landscaping
- New jogging track with krystalpave coating
- Improved krystalpave flooring for the current adult fitness corner
- New motivational signage to encourage users to maintain a healthy lifestyle

- Improved playground with a bigger play area, and new equipment for children from six to 12 years old
- More garden benches for residents to take a break and enjoy the greenery of the garden
- New drop-off canopy at Blk 473 to improve connectivity and provide shelter from rain and sun

### LKY100: Celebrating a green legacy

n May 7, Mr Shawn Huang, MP for Jurong GRC and sustainability champion for Jurong-Clementi Town Council (JRTC), took part in the LKY100 Commemorative Tree Planting drive alongside more than 100 residents and their families from Jurong Spring. As part of the celebration, Mr Huang planted the Cratoxylum formosum (Jack) Dyer (Pink Mempat Tree), the same variety of tree that the late Mr Lee Kuan Yew planted in 1963.

At the event, Mr Huang recounted Mr Lee's efforts to promote sustainability in Jurong when he converted the area from

a mud swamp and tree plantation into an industrial housing estate in the 1960s. "Thanks to Mr Lee, the Chinese Garden and other neighbourhood parks were introduced to Jurong, and residents were able to better enjoy nature in a green environment," said Mr Huang.

Together with Mr Huang, residents and their families planted 21 trees and more than 100 shrubs at the event, which was held at the neighbourhood park along Jurong West St 42. The event is an initiative under the PAP Town Councils' Action for Green Towns.

For Madam Sandi (right 57, planting trees is a way to connect with nature and find peace amid the challenges of everyday life. After a long, stressful day at work, walking around the park and admiring the different colours and textures of the trees helps to bring a sense of calm to her soul. "I feel more creative after connecting with nature, and this is vital for maintaining a healthy and balanced life," she said.

Starting on May 7, JRTC will invite residents and their families to participate in an ongoing tree-planting initiative to plant 600 trees and shrubs across the seven divisions under the purview of the Town Council. 


When were S&CC fees last




#### **UNDERSTANDING S&CC CHARGES**

#### MONEY MATTERS

Town Councils are primarily funded by service and conservancy charges (S&CC) collected from residents and commercial units. While town councils decide on the S&CC rates for their towns and receive an annual operating grant from the Government, they are required to maintain three funds: operating fund, sinking fund, and lift replacement fund.



### SERVICE & CONSERVANCY CHARGES (S&CC) REBATES FOR JUL 2023





While most people in HDB housing estates live amicably and continue to embrace the quintessential kampung spirit, there are instances when differences arise due to inconsiderate behaviour displayed by residents. More often than not, such behaviour is not intentional and can be resolved with minimum intervention. But what happens when grievances escalate?









## Neighbour disputes: What you should know



ccording to a Ministry of National Development report, since 2014, the Housing and Development Board (HDB) has received about 15,600 cases of feedback relating to inconveniences caused by neighbours. While most of these cases are settled privately through mutual talks - there are no statistics on such cases there are other cases where disputes are not easily resolved through talks. For the latter instances, residents are encouraged to approach either their grassroots leaders or the Community Mediation Centre (CMC), which provides trained mediators to help neighbours arrive at mutually acceptable solutions. At times, the HDB also refers cases to the CMC. Since 2014, the CMC has mediated 40 to 50 of such cases each year, of which more than 70 per cent were resolved.

Residents are also protected from neighbourly acts that cause nuisance under two laws – the Community Disputes Resolution Act (CDRA), which prohibits causing unreasonable interference with a neighbour's enjoyment or use of his home; and the Protection from Harassment Act (POHA).

Examples of "unreasonable interference" by neighbours include causing excessive noise, smell, smoke, light or vibration; littering in the vicinity of the resident's home; obstructing the home; interfering with the person's movable property; conducting surveillance on the resident's home; and trespassing.


Jurong-Clementi Town Council (JRTC)
